ENROLLMENT

1. Enrollment period starts in June. It is also possible to enroll and take courses starting from the second semester.
2. Required Qualifications:
 - a. For the Licentiate in Science: undergraduate degree, at least three years
 - b. For the Doctorate: Licentiate in Theology or Science at least *magna cum laude*
 - d. For the Diploma: high-school diploma
3. Documents to be submitted:
 - a. On-line pre-registration
 - b. Application Form
 - c. Identity card or passport
 - d. High school diploma valid for university access
 - e. Letter of presentation: from their Pastor, for lay people;
from their Ecclesiastical Superior, for priests and religious
 - f. Two passport-sized photographs
 - g. Certificate of knowledge of the Italian language (for non-Italian students)
