

LICENTIATE in THEOLOGY OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY

The Licentiate in Theology of Marriage and Family (STL) is designed to achieve theological specialization, pastoral updating and transdisciplinary formation of those who, in the Church, deal with family realities in various ways.


- Duration: 2 academic years (120 ECTS)
- Admission requirement: Canonical Baccalaureate in Theology (STB), at least cum laude
- Learning Outcomes: the student is being trained in a thorough knowledge of the subject matter and educated in scientific methods, in order to be able to teach and to organize continuous formation for young people and adults
- The Study Program is divided into fundamental disciplines, complementary subjects, workshops, and seminars. A final examination and a written dissertation are required



DOCTORATE

IN THEOLOGY / SCIENCES OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY

- Duration: 3 academic years (mandatory first year of full-time presence in Rome)
- Admission Requirements:
 - Canonical Licentiate in Theology magna cum laude (for the Doctorate in theology)
 - Canonical Licentiate in Sciences or Master degree in any discipline related to the family (for the Doctorate in Sciences)
- Learning Outcomes: the doctorate qualifies to teach in a Theological Faculty or Seminary and offers scientific training through research and elaboration of a doctoral dissertation
- Languages: In addition to one's own language and Italian (level B2), the knowledge of at least two other modern languages is encouraged to give access to the relevant scientific literature


